#### Budget Related FYI

As costs continue to increase, my concern over F&B spending, specifically, is heightening each year. I've spent some time reviewing how much we spend on F&B per person (noting that most of our attendees do not have to pay anything to attend). Below are some numbers to keep in mind as we move forward with this event. There will be a need to increase our registration fees for those that do pay to help cover those that do not, reduce the amount of F&B that we offer, or charge a ticket amount in order to continue to be able to afford what we provide and not see a drop in the net revenue.

2024 Total F&B Spend =  $\sim$ \$503,000 (not including Board F&B) Per Person Estimate =  $\sim$ \$530

#### Comp Reg Historical Data

- Numbers reflect REGISTERED, many comps do not show up onsite (though F&B is ordered based on REGISTERED numbers with assumptions for how many generally no show)
