Outline and features of this year's conference

- As an AOC BoD and Japan Chapter secretary, Dr. Kawahigashi was invited to the EW Conference (EW Korea) hosted by the AOC Korea Chapter, where he participated and gave a lecture on "Achieving EMS Superiority through Open Architecture in EW.

- From AOC, President Brian Hinkley, former Region 2 Director Dr. Sue Robertson (UK), Ms. Katherine Head (Australia) were also invited and participated.

- There were about 350 participants in this conference, mainly Koreans (Air Force, companies, research institutes, etc.) but also from overseas, and there were also exhibits (5 Korean companies and 5 overseas companies).

- EW Korea was held at the Militopia Hotel, a Korean military facility near ROKAF Seoul Airport in a suburb of Seoul. It was co-sponsored by the ROK Air Force, the AOC Korea Chapter, and ADD. The Korean electronic warfare community, led by these three organizations, was even more enthusiastic than last year.

- EW Korea 2023 (Oct. 11) was held in a tent as part of Seoul ADEX 2023, an exhibition of ROKAF equipment and instruments, but ADEX is held once every two years, so this year EW Korea was held independently.

- EW Korea itself was larger than last year's event, with more speakers and attendees from abroad. The top leader of the ROK Air Force, who opened the conference, was elevated from last year's Vice Chief of Staff (3-star) to the Chief of Staff (4-star).

- The exhibition was also held in the hallways outside the conference venue and the ballroom, with booths set up by five Korean companies and five foreign companies,

respectively.

- EW Korea has been held almost every year since 2016, but it has been a one-day event. This year, for the first time, it became a two-day event. Tutorials were held in the afternoon of the second day.

--- EW Korea Flow ---

- The official call was held in the ballroom before EW Korea opened, with the presence of Chief of Staff of the ROKAF Lee Young Su (4-star) and the participation of guests and the heads of the co-sponsoring organizations.

- EW Korea opened at 10:30 a.m. After the opening address by the Senior Leaders, an invited lecture (by AOC President Hinkley) and a keynote speech (by the Director of ADD Radar Electronics Technology Center) were given. Before lunch, the exhibitors were pleased to have the 4-star leader's exhibit visit, guided by Chief of Electro-magnetic Warfare Branch. Lunch was served at a banquet in the Grand ballroom for distinguished guests and co-hosting organization heads, and at a reception hall on the second floor of an adjacent wedding hall for the general participants.

- In the afternoon of Day 1, there were two sessions of theme presentations: Session 1: Strategies for Electronic Warfare Development and Session 2: Technological Trends in Electronic Warfare Devices 1, with four and five presentations, respectively. In Day 2, Session 3 was held with 5 presentations. In the afternoon, there was a tutorial (Fundamentals, Principles, and Working Knowledge of Electronic Warfare Equipment) with a two-hour lecture by AOC Sue Robertson and two short presentations by the Korean Air Force.

- On the Day 2, there was a discussion between AOC Korea, AOC HQ, and ROK Air Force officials on the development of AOC Asia 2025 next year.







Distance between the two venues is 6 km straight and 8 km by road. Transportation such as charted minibus or taxi pool will be helpful. Taxi will take about 15 minutes. One chartered bus will provide round trip every 60 minutes.

--- Plan of AOC Asia 2025 (Militopia Hotel) Exhibition ---

-AOC HQ requirement of exhibition space is 600 m². Assuming to use Fortress room (1F) for the conference, Grand ballroom (2F) will provide this space. In addition, hallways outside Fortress (1F) and Grand ballroom (2F) can be used as this year, accommodating 5 exhibition booths / hallway. In addition, adjacent Wedding Hall has plenty of free space, and it may be used. Wedding Hall fee had not been included in the original cost estimation, but it may not to be very expensive since the facility is not used in weekdays for wedding.

-Wedding Hall reception hall IRIS (2F) is used for lunch in EW Korea 2024 in Day 1 and Day 2. So, it is appropriate to provide lunch in AOC Asia 2025 as well.

- It is important to include 4-star ROKAF leader to obtain ROKAF support. Formal letters of AOC to ROKAF and to ADD are desirable.

--- Attendees ----

-Not so many international attendees are expected for AOC Asia 2025 as in AOC Annual Symposium or AOC Europe. It may attract people if it is held with ADEX.
-AOC Asia 2025 attendees will attend ADEX 2025, but ADEX 2025 attendees will not attend AOC Asia 2025 except limited EW specialists.

--- Personal opinion about exhibit and attendees (H. Kawahigashi) ---

- Exhibit: ADEX exhibitors mainly consist of Korean big companies (Hyundai, Hanwha, Korean Air etc.), Korean SMEs, International defense companies (Elbit, SAAB, MBDA, IAI etc.), US big companies (Boeing, BAE systems, Northrop Grumman etc.).

The ADEX exhibits are all in large tents and unsettled atmosphere makes it difficult to show demonstrations or talk in depth. Exhibits in Militopia Hotel may be able to take these roles, as is often the case with a small conference accompanying large events. It is worthwhile to consider providing transportation service between ADEX and AOC Asia venues, so that ADEX attendee attends AOC Asia as well.

- Considerations Regarding Participants from Japan: AOC Asia 2025 is new and may not attract as many people as AOC Europe to attend for business. On the other hand, travel cost from Japan to Korea is reasonable compared to US and Europe, making it attractive as a joyful trip. For that, it is essential to hold it in conjunction with ADEX. Additionally, shopping and sightseeing in Korea are popular among Japanese women, and the participants may increase if the organizers make it convenient for the people to participate with their families. One example is to arrange Korean military-owned hotels in downtown Seoul for accommodation.
