Amanda "Chester" Brockermeyer is a US Navy veteran of nine years, serving as a Naval Flight Officer on EA-6Bs with two deployments to Afghanistan and 153 combat missions. During her second deployment, she led operational testing of new combat equipment – the upgraded ALQ-99 Low Band Transmitter. She holds a bachelor's degree in Chemistry from the US Naval Academy and a master's degree in Administrative Leadership from the University of Oklahoma.

Chester is the director of space production and development and Assured Position, Navigation, and Timing (A-PNT) strategy at Northrop Grumman. She is responsible for the overall growth of the established space production line, including the product development, financial performance and investments and customer relationships. The A-PNT strategy includes the road-mapping of technology transfer from our early technology incubator division through transition to production. Chester's background in program management, strategic planning and product development includes leading teams through all phases of the product's life cycle across numerous aerospace programs at Raytheon for eight years and Northrop Grumman for seven years.

Amanda launched her service to the AOC, first on the AOC Board of Governors in 2014 where she began the revitalization of the STEM scholarships at the HQ level as an added layer of scholarship opportunities in addition to all the awesome STEM scholarship activities at the chapter level. Amanda has served on the AOC Board of Directors as an At Large Director for two terms (2015-2018 and 2018-2021). During that time, she launched the young crows initiative to build interest and advocacy for crows earlier in their career, and she served as the Communications Chair, facilitating the pivot to a new website. She served on the Building Committee which fostered the sell-off of the old HQ, established a temporary residence for the AOC Staff, and finally found a fantastic permanent office for our AOC HQ to call their resident nest. Currently, Amanda serves as both the AOC Vice President and the Pacific Region Director (2022-present), serving on the Membership Committee. She is leading Future Leaders Committee and co-chairing the Empowering Women in EW Committee – two new initiatives which will have their inaugural events at the International Symposium this December.
